Wednesday 24th March
Exeter Livestock Centre

- A. All animals to arrive at the Livestock Centre between 11.00 and 14.00 on Tuesday 23rd March.
- B. Our veterinary inspector, Duncan Findlay MRCVS, will be carrying out inspections on all animals at the Centre on Tuesday 23rd March between the hours of 14.00 and 16.00. If animals are not made ready to be inspected during those times the Society reserves the right to refuse entry to the Sale. Any member who has an animal rejected will have their entry fee refunded.
- C. All measurements (frame scores) of bulls will be shown at the sale. EBVs will be published in the catalogue for cattle from Breedplan recorded herds, and will be on display on each pen as applicable. Bulls registered after 1st January 2010 must be DNA tested for myostatin and the result published or otherwise made known in the sale ring.
- D. Judging will take place at 09.00 on Wednesday morning and the Sale will start at 12.30 pm.

CLASSES

BULLS

1. Bulls from 12 months to 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ years of age. This class may be divided.
2. Bulls over the age of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ years (*for sale only*).

FEMALES

1. Cow of any age, in calf or with calf at foot.
2. Heifers under the age of 3 years 3 months on the day of sale, with calf at foot or warranted to calve by that age.
3. Heifers from 1 year 3 months to 2 years 3 months, in calf, running with the bull or not served.
4. Heifers from 9 months to 15 months of age.
5. Non halter-broken females (*for sale only*), classes as for halter-broken.

NOTES

1. ENTRY FEES:

Bulls, & females (including calf at foot) £30 + VAT

Animals not forward due to illness but with a veterinary certificate will receive a £10 + VAT reimbursement.

The entry fee, pedigree certificate, and organic certificate (where applicable) must be enclosed when returning the completed entry form for each animal.

2. INSPECTION OF ALL ENTRIES

Once at the Sales Centre all bulls will be weighed and all halter broken entries inspected and checked for locomotion, temperament, active infection (eg ringworm, etc), and defects (eg jaws, testicles, hernia, etc) by the veterinary inspector. Those found to be not up to standard will be rejected. No entry thus rejected may be sold through the ring and must be removed from the sale pens.

Halter-broken and non-halter broken females will also be subject to an inspection, with particular attention paid to jaw, legs, locomotion and feet.

Bulls - Scrotal Circumference:

Bulls aged 12-14 months	31 cms
Bulls aged 15-20 months	33 cms
Bulls aged 21-30 months	35 cms
Bulls over 31 months	36 cms

Failure to meet the above measurements will mean automatic rejection from the sale.

3. DISPERSAL SALES

If a member wishes to disperse his/her herd immediately after the Society Sale they may do so provided that it is the whole herd. The cattle are subject to a reduced entry fee of £10 + VAT per animal, which must be enclosed with the entry forms and pedigree certificates and received by the closing date.

4. JUDGING

Animals bred by the judge will have to be placed by another person. The person so nominated by the Society will not enter the ring until all other animals in the class concerned have been placed by the judge. The person nominated will then enter the ring and place the animal concerned.

If a judge enters an animal for any Society Sale it may be *SOLD* only, but the entry in the catalogue will remain in the appropriate show class. The animal will be paraded in its class but will be removed at the instruction of the steward before judging.

5. CATALOGUE INFORMATION

Up to 50 words of information may be provided by the Vendors for the catalogue. An additional 30 words may be added at a charge of £0.10/word.

EBVs - all Breedplan recording members will have their animals' EBVs published in the catalogue as appropriate. **Caesarean births** - members are reminded that they must declare caesarean births for all entries at Society Sales. **Herd health declarations** - information will be taken from completed Herd Health Declarations submitted to the South Devon office at the same time as the completed entry forms, and will be printed in the sale catalogue. No other information relating to herd health, or individual animal health status will be published in the catalogue. Vendors may display additional information on the animal pen. The Herd Health Declaration will be displayed on the animal pen.

6. TB TESTING and BLUETONGUE VACCINATION

All animals are required to have been tested clear of TB within 60 days prior to the Sale date. All animals are required to have been vaccinated for BTV8 (initial dose and booster) within the past 12 months.

7. AUCTIONEER

John Wakeham will conduct the Sale, assisted by a second auctioneer from Kivells.

WORLD CONGRESS 2011

From West to East - across the great southern land - the 2011 South Devon World Tour will cross Australia.

Four separate tours, or a combination of some or all, will allow for your budget and time constraints as the southern areas of Australia are traversed by road, air and ferry. An exciting programme is planned to include many of our tourist and agricultural areas and unique Australian highlights as we focus on our South Devon cattle.

Tour 1 begins in Perth, **Western Australia**. There will be the opportunity to walk over the treetops in the big timber country of the south-west corner, and to see spectacular bird life. Wildflowers are in bloom at this time (October 2011).

After flying to **South Australia**, Tour 2 will include the Fleurieu Peninsula south of Adelaide, with vineyards, orchards, dairy and beef cattle, and coastlines. In the north of this State, the Flinders Ranges and Arid Lands Botanic Gardens will give an insight to what over 60% of Australia looks like. Medical care given by the Royal Flying Doctor Service, the School of the Air, will give a taste of "the great outback". Staying in Australia's oldest mining town, Burra, settled by the Cornish miners in the 1840s, our Cornish friends will see many familiar names and icons.

Farming in the 90-mile desert and the rich areas of the State will lead us into **Victoria** with the Great Ocean Road and the 12 Apostles, then on to the gold mining areas where the Conference will be held. Following the Business sessions of the Conference, tour 3 will continue through the area of Victoria known as the Gippsland with a visit to the world renowned motor sport area of Phillip Island. Here there will be an opportunity to see the Penguin Parade as the birds make their way to their burrows at dusk.

Crossing Bass Strait by ferry we reach **Tasmania**, "The Apple Isle", once a convict penal settlement where beautiful scenery and wildlife now dominate.

Tour 4 will see us in **Queensland**, having flown from Tasmania, and the opportunity to taste the tropical fruits of the area, travelling through rainforests, hinterlands and plains. Gaze at the Glasshouse Mountains, and visit the world's largest ginger factory to walk under the roots of the ginger plant. Crossing the Great Dividing Range, the more open Queensland plains will place the horizon at a distance as we make our way down to **New South Wales** and the Australian South Devon, Breedplan and ABRI headquarters at Armidale. Travelling through the Hunter Valley we will arrive in Sydney where one of the most beautiful waterways in the world awaits us for a farewell Dinner Cruise.

All this will be complimented by on-property visits to Australian South Devon herds along the way.

PUBLICATION OF MYOSTATIN STATUS

As of 1st January it is obligatory for all bulls being registered as pedigree to be tested for their myostatin status, as well as sire verification, at time of registration. This is a big step forward for the breed and will enable breeders to make more informed selection choices within their herds, and when buying bulls.

Information is now available on the website for bulls which have already been tested (although Liz still has a bit of a backlog of data to input). Just to remind you, the myostatin test result will only be published two weeks after the breeder is informed of the status just in case he chooses to de-register the pedigree as a result of the myostatin test.

CATTLE HEALTH SCHEMES, HERD PROTECTION & BIOSECURITY

There are three certainties in what can be a confusing area:

- 1 No one can live with endemic disease because it drains the pocket and destroys morale
- 2 Elite health status (genuine freedom from endemic disease) can be destroyed by a moment's carelessness or a simple accident
- 3 We should all contribute to a national plan to eliminate BVD, IBR, MAP (Johnnes disease) and of course TB

So what can each of us that keeps cattle do? Starting with the basic facts:

- a Animals carrying BVD, Lepto, IBR and MAP can all look perfectly healthy (even BVD carriers)
- b BVD carriers (PIs) shed virus continually. Lepto, IBR and Johnnes carriers shed the infective organism intermittently under stress, and Johnnes infected cattle shed continually once they have developed clinical signs
- c Even animals vaccinated for any of these diseases can shed the causative organism if they had been infected before vaccination
- d All of these diseases can be carried by the unborn calf in a "healthy" pregnant heifer or cow purchased from a "healthy" herd

For breeders whose livelihood largely depends on selling bloodstock the certainty that you are selling clean stock, backed by CHeCS certification provides huge confidence to you and a very real benefit to the purchaser. This is because selling a vaccinated animal only, means that the animal is less likely to break down with disease, not that they cannot carry or shed the causative organism, while an accredited animal will almost certainly be disease free as it leaves the farm.

CHeCS schemes still allow vaccination to protect breeding animals against BVD and IBR (using the marker vaccine), *but don't vaccinate that exceptional bull calf whose semen you want to export.*

Leptospirosis remains outside the vaccine protection envelope because there is as yet no marker vaccine. Johnnes vaccines provide no way forward in breeding herds.

CHeCS does leave you at some risk BUT good biosecurity does answer most of the questions:

- 1 Double boundary fence to a width of more than 3 metres. That fence must withstand the neighbour's bull as I know to my very considerable cost
- 2 Show teams must live in strict isolation all year and be rigorously tested in isolation one month after the season ends
- 3 All purchases must be isolated for 30 days and tested before entering the herd
- 4 Water must be piped and pure, fence all watercourses

For commercial herds and those who keep a few placid cows as a delightful hobby, vaccinate for all the major diseases, observe sensible biosecurity, eg isolate and test purchases, and look every gift horse in the mouth. Rest assured the money spent on vaccination will cut your vet's bill. As regards Johnnes disease, simply checking any animal that is inexplicably losing condition may give you the chance to eliminate a carrier and prevent the spread of an insidious disease.

For those who doubt the value of isolation and test policies don't forget other diseases that often surface after transport stress such as the 3000 guinea heifer that aborts with Neospora, or the prize bull who develops red water fever – much safer in isolation.

Finally for everyone, your own LOCAL vet will give the best advice because they know your area, they know the topography of your farm and most of all they know your weaknesses. Some visiting expert will believe everything you say!!
